**On 04-03-2024 between 7.40 p.m. to 8.10 p.m. :** Hon'ble Prime Minister of India will proceed to Raj Bhavan from Begumpet Airport from, via Airport Y Junction, Right Turn Under PNT Fly Over, Shoppers Stop, Hyderabad Public School, Begumpet Fly Over, Green lands, Left Turn, Rajiv Gandhi Statue/Monappa Island Junction, Yashoda Hospital, MMTS, Raj Bhavan.

**On 05-03-2024 between 09.50 am to 10.15 am:** Hon'ble Prime Minister of India will proceed to Begumpet Airport from Raj Bhavan, via MMTS, Yashoda Hospital, Rajiv Gandhi Statue/Monappa Island Junction, Right turn Pragathi Bhavan, Begumpet Fly Over, Hyderabad Public School, Shoppers Stop, Under PNT Fly Over, Left turn Airport Y Junction, Begumpet airport.

The citizens are requested to take note of above programmes of Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and plan their movements accordingly and co-operate with the Hyderabad Traffic Police.

**TRAFFIC ADVISORY**

In view of the meeting in connection with the issue of Appointment orders to the selected candidates for State Govt. Jobs in Telangana Social Welfare Department etc., at LB Stadium, the following traffic restrictions are likely to be implemented on **04.03.2024** from **2 p.m. to 8 p.m.**

**The traffic will be either stopped or diverted at the following places/routes on need basis:**

1. Traffic coming from AR Petrol Pump Jn. (Public Gardens) towards BJR Statue will not be allowed and will be diverted at A.R. Petrol Pump towards Nampally.
2. Traffic coming from Basheerbagh towards A.R. Petrol Pump will not be allowed and will be diverted at BJR Statue towards, SBI, Abids- Nampally station road.
3. Traffic coming from Sujatha School lane towards Khan Lateef Khan building will not be allowed and will be diverted at Sujatha School junction towards Nampally.

**Junctions to be avoided between 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. on 04.03.2024:**

Panjagutta, VV Statue, Khairatabad flyover, Ambedkar Statue, NTR Marg, Telugu Thalli, Iqbal Minar, Ravindra Bharathi, Hyderabad Traffic Police Junction, Basheerbagh, BJR Statue Circle, SBI Gunfoundry, Abids Circle, A.R. Petrol Pump (Public Gardens), Nampally, KLK Building, Liberty, Himayath Nagar, Assembly, MJ Market and Hyderguda.

**RTC Buses:**

The RTC Buses plying from Ravindra Bharathi towards BJR Statue should avoid L.B. Stadium main Gate i.e. in front of Khan Lateef Khan Building and take diversion at A.R. Petrol (Public Gardens) bunk towards Nampally.

## **Hyderabad City Police initiates a program to tackle the growing menace of substance abuse among students!**

### **Over 1000 schools attended the program**

**Hyderabad, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2024: Hyderabad City Security Council (HCSC) and Hyderabad City Police (HCP)** under the stewardship of **Shri K. Sreenivasa Reddy, IPS, Commissioner of Police Hyderabad & Hon'ble Chairman HCSC** along with **Shri KGSS Srikanth, Joint Secretary, Anti- Narcotics Forum, HCSC**; hosted a meeting of Schools administrators in Hyderabad, Cyberabad and Rachakonda city police Commissionerate areas, at the Telangana Police Command and Control Centre, ICCC, today. This program unveiled an interaction between the stake holders, especially schools, to tackle the growing menace of substance abuse among students. Over 1000 schools attended the program.

The event emphasized the importance of training the students with enough life skills to combat narcotics addictions and other challenges of life as the only means to develop them into well-rounded individuals. In the light of this, the life skills training manual ideated and authored by Sri KGSS Srikanth Joint Secretary Anti- Narcotics groups was launched jointly by **Shri Burra Venkatesham, IAS, Principal Secretary, Education Department and Collegiate Education Commissioner, Sri Devasena, IAS, Commissioner School education** and the three police commissioners of city **Sri K Srinivas Reddy IPS, Sri Avinash Mohanty IPS, Sri Tarun Joshi IPS** along with guest of honor **Sandeep Shandiliya** Director general of police Telangana state bureau.

Addressing the gathering, the Chief Guest **Shri Burra Venkatesham, IAS, Principal Secretary, Education Department and Collegiate Education Commissioner**, said, the future and safety of our country is being framed in the classroom, today, if we ignore the classroom, we are heading towards disaster. We all need to work together seriously on this issue of drug abuse among children. Hyderabad should become drug free city and Telangana should become drug free state. Henceforth we will meet every quarter to assess and discuss the progress in our pursuit to make Telangana the topmost educated and cultured state in the country.

**Shri K. Sreenivasa Reddy, IPS, Commissioner of Police**; said, the response for the program organized for schools and their managements from across the tri-Commissionerate of Hyderabad, Cyberabad and Rachakonda city police, has been overwhelming and indicates your commitment to the cause. Drug abuse has been on the rise and is not even sparing schools and colleges. To help pursue the cause and make this city free of drugs, schools need to play a role by conducting surveillance of surrounding shops to monitor the sale of edibles associated with drugs. Monitor students for sudden behavioral changes and also caution parents to do the same at homes. Drug mafia is constantly on lookout for gullible students reeling under stress, so schools should have mechanism to address academic stress. Every school should

have Anti-drug committees to help freeing the school and the society from this menace. The police and the education departments are available to render the necessary support.

**Shri Sandeep Shandilya**, IPS, Director, Telangana State Anti-narcotics Bureau; said, in today's society peer pressure, lack of love among children is being compensated with money. Kids take to drugs because they are unhappy with your comparison, with peer pressure, lack of love, lack of recognition, all these are leading to a stressful situation and that's how he slowly gets into such bad habits. Therefore, don't put the child in a rat race. All stakeholders, including parents, teachers, law enforcement, must uphold their responsibilities to effectively tackle this threat.

**Shri Avinash Mohanty**, IPS, Commissioner of Police Cyberabad, said, this vice is the most dangerous to the human society, there is nothing which has destroyed as much as drugs has in the past and it is continuing to do so. People take to drugs to gain some relief or to celebrate. This vice can be addressed in the peer groups of family, the school, the friends circle, but where all these peer groups overlap is the school, parents, teachers, friends all come together and is the best place to address the vice. Therefore, the schools have a major role to play, we look forward to your continued support and we will be more than happy to support you and systematically addressing this concern.

**Dr Tarun Joshi**, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Rachakonda, said, creating awareness about the drug menace is the need of the hour, an issue which is really bothering all of us. Here, we are discussing about a generation, which is getting impacted by a menace which is assuming very alarming proportions now. There is tremendous change in the parent child relationship, today there is hardly any personal touch between the two. The parents are not aware of what their child is doing. At the same time there is a communication gap between the students and teachers. This program is an attempt to reach out to you, to look up for your support, as this is a shared responsibility of all of us, as members of the society and as the custodians of the next generation.

**Smt. A. Sridevasena**, IAS, Commissioner and Director of School Education, Telangana, said, we are all equally guilty for a topic which should have never been an issue. It is the responsibility of all of us to see that no child and parent suffers due to this menace. This is not an issue happening in isolation, but something which is seeping under the carpet and one fine day you will experience a big jolt. Many private schools are concerned about their reputation or the trauma the child would undergo if reported, but we assure you that neither the schools name nor the child's name will be revealed when we get to the root of the issue. Request all of you not to look at it as a taboo, no matter what, we have to do this. Whatever information you get, please share it with the police, share with the parents.

**Shri Bharani Aroll**, Advisor, HCSC; said, a student spends an average time of 10.5% in the school during his life, during this time imagine the kind of impact the teachers can create on a student, be it educational or even behavioral, it would be much more than 30% to 40%, you create a huge impact on the students, that's one of the reason that this program has been designed to be a collaborative effort. Each one of us have

the responsibility to prevent this menace. We need to together build an India, Telangana and Hyderabad, which is drug free.

**Shri KGSS Srikanth**, Joint Secretary, Anti- Narcotics Forum, HCSC, said, “4 pillars of the society are Government, Schools, Parents & NGOs, Students. These 4 pillars should take a joint action plan to curb the menace of Narcotics and it is high time we do a concerted effort. He also said that shortly, Life Skills Training books will be circulated across Hyderabad schools followed by a workshop with relevant NGOs and School management to arrive at the final curriculum to be implemented as additional program into the curriculum of all schools from next year.”
