PRESS NOTE

SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT ON IMPROPER /WITHOUT REGISTRATION NUMBER PLATE

Hyderabad Traffic Police is taking strict action on the violators roaming on City roads without registration number plate/Improper Number Plate/Tampered number plate.

Rule No. 50 & 51 of Central Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989 specify the necessity of proper registration number plate (Front and Rear) on the vehicles moving on the roads.

In the special drives conducted, the Hyderabad Traffic Police has booked 20,260 cases in two months i.e., October and November-2018. The below table shows the enforcement particulars on the violation of Rule No. 50 & 51 of Central Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989.

This year so far 70,448 number of cases have been booked. Last year in 2017 43,643 number of cases were booked.

The vehicle owners/drivers do such mischief to avoid challans for their traffic violations, to drive theft vehicles and to commit serious crimes. Hyderabad Traffic Police constituted four special enforcement teams to book cases under violation of CMV Rule 50 & 51 (Improper and Without Number Plate). Criminals also use such tampered number plates to evade the Law Enforcing Agencies.

Citizens are informed that bending of registration number plates is also punishable under central motor vehicle rules. Stringent action will be initiated against owners/drivers who move with tampered number plates and without registration number plates. Cases under Indian Penal Code (IPC) can also be booked under forgery section.

Citizens are requested to inform above violations to Hyderabad Traffic Police through Hyderabad Traffic Police Face book and Twitter, Traffic Help Line (9010203626) and Traffic Live App to curb this violation to ensure safety and security in Hyderabad City.

Therefore, the motorists and vehicle owners are requested to use proper number plates on their vehicles. No unnecessary words should be written on the number plate.
