Sri Anjani Kumar, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad City issued P.D. Orders against Vikram Soni S/o late Balkishan Soni, property offender of Abid Road Police Station on 31.12.2018.

Vikram Soni S/o late Balkishan Soni, aged about 29 years, Occ: Food Panda Worker, n/o Rohtak, Haryana State, presently residing in Priyanka Hostel, Shergate, King Koti, Hyderabad has committed offences of theft of **two wheeler vehicles, mobile phones and laptop under the limits of Hyderabad and Rachakonda Police Commissionerates** to make easy money and lead a lavish life.

The accused has committed 5 offences in the recent past under the limits of Hyderabad and Rachakonda Police Commissionerates and has been creating large scale fear and panic among the general public, thereby adversely affecting the public order, apart from disturbing the peace, tranquillity and social harmony in the society.

Abid Road Police made strenuous efforts and arrested the accused Vikram Soni S/o late Balkishan Soni on 6.10.2018 in Cr.No.239/2018 u/s 380, 109 IPC & 102 Cr.P.C of Abid Road Police Station and remanded him to judicial custody. The Preventive Detention Order was executed on him on 7.1.2019 and he was lodged in Central Prison, Chanchalguda, Hyderabad.

### **2000 persons getting jobs at 'Job Connect' programme in Falaknuma organized by the Hyderabad Police.**

The Falaknuma police on 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2019, Saturday organized a “**Job Connect**” programme at **The Progress High School, Engine Bowli Falaknuma** as part of its ‘community policing’ initiative. The Programme is conducted under the supervision of **Sri K. Srinivasa Rao Inspector of Police, PS Falaknuma, Hyd** with the guidance of **Sri M.A.Rasheed Asst. Commissioner of Police Falaknuma Divison**, with the assistance other Police officials.

A total of **4,200 youth** both men and women holding various educational qualifications had attended the programme held between **9 a.m and 5 p.m. About 23 companies** who participated in the programme offered various jobs including electrician, security guards, para medical, accountant, IELTS and IT based jobs and others. The companies offered jobs for varied educational qualifications both technical and no technical between seventh standard and Post Graduation levels.

Job aspirants from across the old city and neighbouring areas of **Mailardevpally, Pahadishareef, Balapur and Rajendranagar** also turned up at the programme. Companies who participated in the event area Apollo Pharmacy, Kairos Composite Services Private Limited, GVK Emergency Management and Research Institute, Big Bazaar (Future Group), Aegis Customer Support Services among other companies. The pay roll offered was between **Rs. 96,000 per annual to Rs. 3 lakh per annum.**

In the run up to the event, the Falaknuma police had earlier organized road shows and street corner enrolment camps to mobilize and facilitate the job aspirants for registering for the program. In the total **2,000 about 800 were meant were meant for the women candidates.**

**Hyderabad Commissioner Anjani Kumar, IPS** said that the Telangana police are taking up several “social initiatives” as part of its community based policing initiatives. The Job Connect is one such initiative. “We want our youth to stand a top in the country and become a partner in the development of the society and lead a happy and dignified life. Our Job Connect van moves around the city bridging the gap between the job aspirants and recruiting companies,” he said.

**Deputy Commissioner of Police, Amber Kishore Jah, IPS** said that the police had ensured that the many women and girls are turning up for the event. “It shows there is a demand for jobs from the women and girls. Keeping note of it in previous experiences we have approached few companies including IELTS based who are keen on offering jobs to women. Eight hundred of the 2,000 jobs offered at the event are for the women and girls,” he said.
