Strict Action Against Traffic Violators

'Zero Tolerance' for Drunken Drive

Review of Hyderabad Traffic Department's Performance

Hyderabad CP Sri V. C. Sajjanar, IPS, warned that strict action will be taken against those who violate traffic rules. He made it clear that **drunken driving will not be tolerated** under any circumstances.

CP Sri V. C. Sajjanar, IPS, conducted a review meeting on the Traffic Department at the TGICCC Auditorium in Banjara Hills, Hyderabad. He inquired about the ground-level problems faced by the personnel during their duties. He also received suggestions and advice to further improve traffic policing. Subsequently, he issued directives to the traffic staff on several key issues.

He lauded the traffic personnel, stating that they are the *'Face of Hyderabad Police'*, and praised them for bringing a good name to the police department through their commitment and dedication. He expressed satisfaction that the performance of the Traffic Department in Hyderabad is improving day by day.

He ordered the staff not to tolerate violations like *Drunken Drive, Minor Driving, Wrong Route, Dangerous Driving*, etc., and to take action as per law. He announced that 'Convergence Meetings' with officials from all departments will be organized regularly every month starting from November 27. He stated that traffic issues will be discussed at these meetings to find solutions.

He instructed the formation of special teams to conduct a scientific study on U-turns. He suggested that the *Real-Time Traffic Monitoring System* should be further strengthened. He also directed the staff to formulate a plan to curb traffic problems using technology.

He assured that excellent performance in duty would be duly recognized, but explicitly warned that corruption on the roads would not be tolerated.

He stated that Hyderabad Traffic Police need to *work as a 'Multiplayer*'. He directed traffic officials to visit and inspect accident sites when road accidents occur. He announced that a Traffic Command Control Center Protocol will be established soon. Keeping the traffic congestion in Hyderabad in mind, he ordered all senior officials to take proactive steps towards resolving the traffic problem.

The meeting was attended by Joint CP Traffic Sri D. Joel Davis, IPS, DCP Traffic Sri R. Venkateswarlu, IPS, DCP Traffic Sri S. Srinivas, ACPs, Inspectors, and approximately 450 police personnel from the Hyderabad Traffic Department.
